(ADVANCE) KANSAS CITY, MARCH 7 (MVC)-It's Cincinnati in the National Collegiate (MCAA) and Michita and Louisville in the National Invitational (NIT) basketball tournaments.

The Missouri Valley Conference landed three of its members in the two big post-season cage attractions following one of its finest competetive season in history.

The Cincinnati Bearcats, who clinched the MVC title a week ago, will play in the Mid-west Regional MCAA meet in Lubbock, Tex., Friday and Saturday. The Bearcats' first round foe in Lubbock will be winner of the Oklahoma City University-Texas Western game in Wichita, Kan. (EDITORS: please check winner and update graf).

The NCAA champion in 1961 and 1962 and runner-up in 1963, Cincinnati won the Valley crown 10-4 and had a 21-5 regular season record.

An NIT bid went to Wichita, 9-5 in the league after beating Tulsa 81-79 in double overtime in Tulsa Saturday. The Shockers arei7-9 overall. Second seeded, Wichita goes into the second round of the NIT Honday night against the winner of a first round game Thursday night between DePaul and NYU. It will be Wichita's fourth appearance in the HIT. The Shockers lost first round games their previous three tournaments.

The Louisville Cardinals, 8-6 in the NVC and 16-9 overall, will meet Boston College in a first round game Saturday night. Louisville won the NIT in 1956.

Wichita's Jamie Thompson, 6-3 junior from Wichita, won the individual scoring championship for all games played with a 22.1 average in 26 games. Westley Unseld, whose rebounding and scoring was the key to Louisville's NIT bid, was second in scoring with a 19.3 average in 25 games.

Julian Hammond, Tulsa's 6-5 senior from Chicago, was a big winner in the field goal percentage race, making 172 od 261 shots for ,659. Hammond missed the NCAA record of .660 per cent by Tim Kehoe of St. Peter's last season by only a fraction of a percentage point.

Gene Demaree, 5-11 Tulsa senior from Madison, Ind., had the best free throw percentage mark for players making a minimum of 45 shots. He missed only 2 of 47 for .957 per cent.

Unseld, a 6-8 shphomore from Louisville, won the rebounding laurels going away. He averaged 19.1 on 479 captures in 25 games, a national record.

The Bradley Braves completed their season with a 9-5 MVC record by beating St. Louis, 72-68, in a regionally televised game in St. Louis Saturday. Bradley and Wichita tied for second and third places in the final standings.
