TULSA, OKLA. --- Post-season tournament selection committees have re-affirmed the contention that some of the best basketball in the country is played in the Missouri Valley Conference. For the first time in Conference history, four Valley teams have earned berths in tournaments.

League champion Louisville and runner-up New Mexico State were picked to play in the NCAA playoffs. The Cardinals will meet Rutgers in the Midwest Regionals in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The Aggies travel to Charlotte, to face Atlantic Coast Conference champion North Carolina.

Drake finished third in the league standings and is the Conference representative in the National Commissioners' Invitational Tournament in Louisville. The Bulldogs are paired with Southern California. The fourth Valley team picked is Southern Illinois and the Salukis face Pittsburgh in first round action in the National Invitation Tournament in New York.

"It's a fitting climax to another great year of basketball action in the Missouri Valley Conference," said Commissioner Mickey Holmes. "It's always gratifying to have outsiders recognize the high caliber of play that characterizes Valley competition."

SIU'S MIKE GLENN EARNS FINAL MVC "PLAYER" AWARD

Southern Illinois' sharpshooting guard Mike Glenn has been selected as the final winner of the Missouri Valley Conference player-of-the-week award. Glenn capped off an outstanding sophomore season in characteristic fashion, hitting on 8 of 11 field goal attempts for 16 points in leading the Salukis past Creighton 53-47.

The 6-3 guard added four assists to go along with his scoring and turned in an outstanding defensive performance, holding Creighton's Charles Butler to nine points, despite giving up two inches in height.

Glenn, who is often compared to former Saluki great Walt Frazier, drew raves from Creighton Coach Tom Apke. "Southern Illinois and Glenn played a great defensive game. They never let us get into our offense," said Apke. "Glenn is one of the great guards in college basketball."
