



OUTLOOK

New Bradley Coach Stan Albeck will inherit 10 letterwinners and three starters from last year's team that went 32-3, made every writer's top 10 poll by season end, won 22 straight games during one stretch and ran away with the Missouri Valley Conference championship with an unblemished 16-0 record.

Repeating as MVC champions will be Albeck's primary goal this season since Bradley will not be able to play in any post-season tournaments due to NCAA sanctions.

No school in the Valley has won back-to-back conference titles since Louisville turned the trick in 1974 and 1975. Since then eight schools have won or shared the league championship but none have been able to win it outright two years in a row. This will be Bradley's third try during that span.

Headlining the trio of returning starters is 6-3 junior guard Hersey Hawkins, who was named to Playboy magazine's preseason all-America team. . Hawkins was a first-team all-conference selection last year as he blossomed into national prominence with two last second shots, an 18.7 scoring average and a balanced floor game which produced 656 points, 200 rebounds and 104 assists. He was the only Valley player last season to appear in the league's top 10 in seven statistical categories and was player of the week an unprecedented four times.

Junior forwards Trevor Trimpe (4.7 scoring average, 4.5 rebound average) and Donald Powell (8.7 points, 5.3 rebounds) are the other returning starters while the bench returns intact.

One member of that bench is a 5-11 sophomore Anthony Manuel, who will likely inherit the other starting guard spot opposite Hawkins. Manuel figures to replace graduated Jim Les, who was second in scoring behind Hawkins last season and was selected Player of the Year in the MVC.

In addition to Les, the Braves also lost 255-pound center Mike Williams. Williams' replacement up front figures to be a battle between talented 6-8 freshman Luke Jackson, juniors Jerry Thomas or Greg Jones and possibly 6-8 junior Bruce Mordini, a deft shooter who was red-shirted last season. Jackson graduated from high school in December of 1985 and has been enrolled at Bradley since January.



Second-year coach Tony Barone has two starters returning from last year's team that went 12-16 overall and posted upset victories over two teams that went to the NCAA tournament — Tulsa and DePaul.

Back for the Bluejays are 6-4 senior forward Kenny Evans, 6-4 senior forward/ guard Gary Swain, 5-10 senior Renard Edwards and 6-6 junior forward Ted Stefaniak.

Evans, Swain and Edwards were regulars for the Bluejays last season. Evans was the team's leading scorer and rebounder last season, averaging 15.9 points and 8.5 rebounds a year ago. He finished third in the league in rebounding and fifth in scoring. Evans wasn't originally expected back this season but was granted an extra year of

eligibility after receiving a medical hardship due to a knee injury sustained two years ago.

Swain averaged 12.3 points and 3.0 rebounds a game and ranked second in the league in steals with 40. Edwards added 5.4 points and 2.6 rebounds per game and was voted the most improved player of the squad by his teammates.

Seven new faces will appear on the Creighton roster this season — one junior college transfer and six freshmen.

Having the most collegiate playing experience among the Creighton newcomers is Rod Mason, a 6-3 junior guard from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M Junior College. Mason averaged 17 points, three rebounds and five assists per game at Northeastern.

The freshman include 6-11 center Mike Pomeroy, 6-8 Brian Darcy, 6-7 Bill Nygard, 6-7 Tony King, 6-6 Todd Eisner and 6-4 Matt Roggenburk. Pomeroy averaged 15.4 points and 12.0 rebounds per game in high school; Darcy averaged 17 points and 12 rebounds; Nygard had averages of 16.5 points and 11 rebounds; King scored 12.8 points and pulled down 9 rebounds per game; Eisner averaged 22.8 points and 9 rebounds; Roggenburk averaged 17 points and 6 rebounds and 6


"The experience factor — how quickly players become acclimated to the collegiate world academically and athletically — is going to determine the success of the team," Barone said.

Creighton faces a grueling schedule, including 16 games against teams which played in the NCAA or NIT tournaments last year.

"Last year we established credibility, beating teams like Tulsa and DePaul," Barone said. "This year we need to build upon the foundation established last season and look to the future."

OUTLOOK

Drake University returns three starters from the team that posted a 19-11 record a year ago while advancing to the first round of the National Invitation Tournament.

After being picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference a year ago, Drake posted a 10-6 conference record that earned a second place tie with Tulsa in the regular season. The Bulldogs lost to the Hurricane by a single

point in the semi-finals of the league tournament.

The three returning starters include junior guard Glenn Martin, sophomore center Bart Friedrick and senior David Miller, who has been moved from forward to the off guard spot.

Miller, 6-4, led the team a year ago in scoring (15.2), field goal percentage (51.8%) and free throw percentage (86%). He was named Newcomer of the Year in the MVC and was a second team all-conference selection.

Martin, 6-0, started every game a year ago, averaging 8.5 points per contest. The sure-handed floor leader also averaged 4.5 assists and just 1.8 turnovers per game.

Friedrick made an immediate impact for Drake while starting every game. The 6-10 center averaged 7.8 points and 3.7 rebounds per contest while being named Freshman of the Year in the MVC.

The forward spots look as though they will be filled by seniors David Dahlke and Michael Morgan. Morgan, 6-6, averaged 8.4 points and 6.4 rebounds a year ago.


Dahlke, also 6-6 but 20 pounds heavier than Morgan, is an outside scoring threat who is also a strong rebounder. Last season, the transfer from Minnesota averaged 5.1 points and 2.2 rebounds per contest.

Top newcomers include junior college transfer Walter James, a 6-4 forward who missed last season with a back injury; and freshmen Joey Wright, a 6-3 guard, and Terry Robinson, a 6-8 center.

"I really feel that our returning players, with the experience of last season, will make us a good basketball team," said Garner.

OUTLOOK

Last season, head coach Bob Donewald cited the lack of consistency as a major weakness on the Illinois State basketball team. He hopes to solve that problem this season, however, with something he had little of last year — experience.

The Redbirds return eight lettermen, including four starters, plus two freshmen redshirts from last year's 15-14 team, which finished fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 9-7 mark. Senior Derrick Sanders

heads the list of returnees. Sanders, a 6-6 forward, led the Redbirds in both scoring (12.6) and rebounding (7.4) last year while earning second-team all-Missouri Valley conference accolades. He was Illinois State's Most Valuable Player last season.

Junior forward Tony Holifield, an honorable mention all-MVC pick in 1986, also returns for the Redbirds. The 6-7 Holifield was second on the team in scoring (11.4) and rebounding (5.7) last season.

Junior Cliff Peterson, who started 11 games last season, and sophomore Jon Pemberton, who played in 25 games in his rookie season, also return to bolster the frontline corps. Peterson was voted best defensive player by his teammates last year.

Finding the right combination in the backcourt was a difficult task for Donewald last season. Juniors Matt Taphorn and Jeff Harris, along with sophomore Todd Starks return with starting experience.

Taphorn, a 6-5 swingman, averaged 6.3 points per game last season and was second on the team with 80 assists. The 6-4 Harris averaged 5.3 ppg in 17 minutes played per game. Starks, who started 20 games for ISU, led the team in steals with 32 and was selected to the MVC All-Freshman team. Sophomore guard Sean Morros, a walk-on, rounds out the returning lettermen.

Forwards Sonny Roberts and Kevin DeCraene were redshirted last season and will see their first college action in 1986-87. Roberts chose to sit out and learn the ISU system, while DeCraene sat out with a knee injury. Both could add production to the Redbird offense.

Donewald signed four freshmen this season, including two guards, a swing player and a forward.

OUTLOOK

Indiana State will have plenty of new faces on its roster as Ron Greene enters his second season as the Sycamore head coach.

Ten new players have been added to this year's team and will be joined by three veterans from last year's squad.

The Sycamores lose only two players from a year ago — guard/forward John Sherman Williams and forward Jeff McComb — but both played key roles for Greene, whose club finished

11-17 overall and seventh in the Valley at 5-11.

Williams was the Missouri Valley Conference's leading scorer with a 20.8 average and departed as Indiana State's second all-time leading scorer and third leading scorer in MVC annals.

McComb, who played in all but one game in his four year career, finished his senior season second in rebounding (5.5 average) and third in scoring (7.3).

The three veterans returning for the Sycamores are 6-6 sophomore forward Darrion Applewhite, 6-5 guard sophomore Chris Harris and 6-8 junior forward Larry Bush. Applewhite saw action in all 28 games last season and was selected to the MVC all-freshman team. He finished second in scoring (8.6) and third in rebounding (4.7). Harris likewise played in every game last season and finished second in the conference in steals (41). Bush averaged 6.7 points and 3.8 rebounds last year.

Two other players return from a year ago although neither saw any playing action. Jeff Cooper, a 6-2 guard, broke a bone in his foot and sat out all of last season as did 6-5 junior guard Dion Campbell, a transfer from Oklahoma State.

Among the new faces are two junior college transfers who played high school basketball in Terre Haute, Ind. — 6-8 junior Lee Moore and 7-0 sophomore center Dean Oliphant. Moore averaged 16 points and 11 rebounds a game while playing for Brevard Community College in Florida while Oliphant had averages of 18 points and nine rebounds for Danville (Ill.) Area Community

Several other junior college transfers will be vying for playing time this season. Heading the list is 6-6 guard/forward Benji Frazier, who transferred

from Wabash (Ind.) Junior College where he averaged 13 points and seven rebounds last season. The others are 6-4 guard Joe Jones (Cloud County, Kan.; Community College); 6-0 guard Tony Twitty (Coffeyville Community College); and 6-9 forward Brian Williamson (Allen County Community College).

The Sycamores will also have two foreign-born players — Richie Adderly, a 6-1 guard from Freeport, Bahamas, and Olufemi Akinola, a 6-8 forward from Ondo State, Nigeria.

With the influx of so many new players, Greene is hopeful of turning around the Sycamore program and wiping away the memories of his first season at Indiana State, which saw the Sycamores lose 12 games by five points or less.

He also plans to again emphasize defense, a

OUTLOOK

Southern Illinois University's basketball fortunes appear to be much brighter than a year ago.

"Even though we didn't get several of the recruits we were hoping to land, we'll be a better ball club this season and just continue to work at it until we get the job done," said second-year head coach Rich Herrin.

Returning from last year's 8-20 team will be nine lettermen, including four starters and another who saw considerable playing

Steve Middleton, a junior from Brooklyn, N.Y., and

second-team MVC selection, is expected to provide the leadership for the Salukis this season along with Doug Novsek, Billy Ross and Brian Welch, all of whom earned starter's status last season.

In addition, Randy House, one of the more exciting first-year players at SIU in recent years, returns. Other returning lettermen include Todd Krueger, Wayne Harre and Scott Hesse.

Key newcomers are expected to be Tim Richardson, a transfer from Coffeyville (Kansas) Junior College, freshman Jay Schafer and Kai Nurnberger, who earned a letter as a freshman two years ago before withdrawing temporarily from school.

"With Richardson (6-9/235 lbs.) and Schafer (6-7/210) to go along with Ross and Krueger, we should be stronger on the boards," Herrin said.

"With the additional help inside, we hope to be able to move House outside where he'll probably compete with Novsek for playing time.

"Obviously Middleton is going to be in the game most of the time and it wouldn't surprise me if Nurnberger came in and battled Welch for the point guard position.

"We're still not there . . . we're a long way from it, but I don't think there's any question about being a better ball club than we were a year ago," Herrin added.


Middleton led SIU scorers last season with 427 points (16.4 ppg) while Novsek was runnerup with 346 and a 12.4 ppg average. Ross and House both had fine freshman years and should be set for even better sophomore seasons along with Krueger who already has improved his strength.

OUTLOOK

With four starters and one other letterwinner returning, Tulsa coach J.D. Barnett appears set to build on the accomplishments of last season, his first with the Hurricane.

Barnett, who came to Tulsa after six winning seasons at Virginia Commonwealth, guided the Hurricane to 23 wins, the Missouri Valley Conference tournament championship, an NCAA tournament appearance and the fifth-best scoring defense in the country.

The returning starters include the "M & M Boys," junior guard Tracy Moore and senior forward David Moss. Moore, a first team all-conference selection last season, averaged 16.8 points, while Moss, a second team selection, contributed 14.7 points and 6.4 rebounds. Moore scored in double-figures 28 times last season while Moss led the team in rebounding on 19 occasions.

The two other starters returning are 6-10 center Anthony Fobbs and 6-3 guard Byron Boudreaux. Fobbs averaged 5.1 points and four rebounds per game. Boudreaux, in addition to averaging 9.7 points, had 158 assists in 32 games.

The other letterwinner, 6-11 forward Brian Rahilly, was a part-time starter last season. Rahilly averaged 8.9 points and 4.4 assists, and his strong play during the MVC tournament earned him most valuable player honors.

The only significant losses are guard Herb Suggs, a defensive specialist who started 15 games and averaged 4.4 points, and reserve Jeff Rahilly, who scored 5.6 points and 4.2 rebounds.

Depth was one of the weaknesses which plagued the Hurricane last season, but this year Barnett will have eight new players on his bench.

The list includes 6-7 forward Donald Royster, a rebounding specialist who transferred to Tulsa from Mississippi in the fall of 1985.


The newcomers include 6-2 guard Rodney Johnson, a freshman redshirt who sat out last season, and six incoming freshmen. They are 6-4 guard Greg Johnson, 6-3 guard Brian Loyd, 6-0 point guard Rod Parker, 6-7 forward John Buckwalter, 7-0 center Al Thomsen and 6-2 guard Billy Brown.

OUTLOOK

About the only thing first-year Coach Eddie Fogler has promised upon his arrival at The Wichita State University is that there will be changes in the Shocker basketball program in 1986-87.

Changes that he hopes will propel the Shockers, who return an experienced team of 12 lettermen, back into contention in the Missouri Valley Conference after a 14-14 campaign a year ago.

Fogler will have returning 86 percent of the Shockers' scoring punch and 91

percent of the rebounding.

One player who immediately caught the eye of Fogler upon his appointment was 6-foot-9, 244-pound center-forward Sasha Radunovich. In his first season at Wichita State, the strongman from Yugoslavia earned honorable mention All-Missouri Valley Conference honors after scoring 11.6 points a game and leading the Shockers in rebounding with a 7.3 average.

Other returners battling for positions along the front line will be 6-7 senior Gus Santos, the team's leading scorer a year ago (15.0 points, 5.6 rebounds), 6-8 sophomore Steve Grayer (5.2 points, 3.7 rebounds), junior Cedric Coleman (2.6 points, 2.9 rebounds) and sophomore Dwayne Praylow (1.5 points, 1.1 rebounds).

The center position appears wide open with four players in the hunt for the starting job. Two seniors, John Askew (2.7 points, 1.4 rebounds) and Henry Carr (3.4 points, 3.5 rebounds), made starts a year ago but ended the season in reserve roles. Sophomore Ted Williams (3.1 points, 2.8 rebounds) has added 20 pounds to his 6-9 frame and has displayed the potential to become a fine player. Returning to the squad is 6-10 Tom Kosich, who was forced to redshirt a year ago because of a back injury.

A strength for the Shockers should be in the backcourt where the squad possesses good size and versatility. Gary Cundiff (2.9 points, 1.4 rebounds), Lew Hill (9.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Dwight Praylow (3,9 points, 1.9 rebounds) all made starts for the Shockers a year ago. Hill, a 6-5 senior, can play at either backcourt position and could also swing to forward. The two newcomers to the Shocker squad, freshman Joe Griffin and Brent Bass, will bolster the guard corps.
