-- Evansville is now 16-13 for the season. The Purple Aces' record in the MVC tournament is 7-5. Evansville has been in the league meet six of the 12 years the school has been in the conference. UE won the tourney its first year of participation (1999) and has finished 1-1 on four other occasions, including this season. UE is 0-3 this season vs. Indiana State and has now lost 10 in a row to the Sycamores.

-- Megan Liffick continued an exceptional week which has seen her break into UE's career top 10 in scoring, gain MVC Scholar-Athlete honors and punch up a career-high 25 points in UE's semifinal win over Wichita State. Against Indiana State, Liffick had 13 points to move her career total to 1,132, ninth all time. Liffick is also in the UE career top 10 in three-point field goals (9th with 107 after one Saturday) and free throws made (4th with 307 after 6 Saturday).

-- The Aces' Olivia Grant cracked the UE rebound career top 10 with 4 Saturday. She now has 452 and needs seven more to catch ninth-place Krista Blunk (1989-93).

-- Tricia Cullop is 83-86 in her sixth year at Evansville and overall as a college head coach.

-- Indiana State is now 26-4 for the season. This year's ISU win total is the best in school history. The Sycamores' MVC tournament record is 9-12 and Saturday was their first MVC tourney meeting with Evansville. ISU finished its season 3-0 vs. the Aces and has now won 10 in a row of Evansville. Indiana State has never won this tournament but has now reached the finals for the third time in the past four years, losing in the title game to Missouri State in Des Moines in 2003 and losing to Illinois State in Normal in 2005.

-- ISU guard Lisa Verhoff punched through the 1,000-point plateau Sunday, the 18th player in school history to reach that mark and now has 1,013. Verhoff, ISU's all-time leading three-point field goal percentage shooter, has stayed at the .435 mark for her career with a 436 mark (70/159) log this season. Verhoff is also the career free throw percentage leader at ISU at .893 (175/196) with Saturday's foul line effort. Verhoff is now second in ISU career threes with 207.

-- Stephanie Lisch is bidding to become the Sycamores' 19th 1,000-point scorer with 12 Saturday vs. UE pushing Lisch's career total to 993.

-- ISU's Melanie Boeglin padded her ISU and MVC all-time leading career totals in assists (672) and steals (430) Saturday with three assists and one steal. Her 15 points sent her career total to 1,747, third on the all-time ISU list.

-- The Sycamores' current win streak is four games.

-- Jim Wiede is 107-64 in his sixth year at Indiana State and overall as a college head coach.
