

# Game Four

## Notes



- Evansville ended a two-game losing streak with its 77-73 overtime win over Wichita State in the MVC Quarterfinals. The Purple Aces had lost to Illinois State at home and Indiana State on the road to finish out the regular season.

- UE's Olivia Grant finished with 13 rebounds to move her past Assistant Coach Jenna Hayes in the Evansville record books. Grant now has 448 career rebound to rank 11th in school history and she is just one board shy of moving into the top 10.

- The last time Evansville defeated Wichita State in the quarterfinals of the MVC Tournament in 1999 the Purple Aces went on to win the championship. UE defeated the Shockers, 64-43, then moved on to upset Missouri State and Creighton, becoming the lowest seed to win the tournament at that time.

-Evansville improved to 7-4 in MVC Tournament appearances. Seventeen of Evansville's 28 games have been decided by 10 points or less this season, including nine of its 12 losses.

- Wichita State's Antionette Wells recorded 10 rebounds against the Aces, giving her 204 for the season and marking the 16th time this season she has pulled down double figure boards. She also added 11 points for her 13th double-double of the campaign.

- The Shockers fell to 4-14 overall in MVC Tournament history. Wichita State extended its Valley tournament losing streak to four straight games, with its last win coming over Missouri State in 2002.

- Lexee McDonnell hit one three-pointer in the contest to take hold of sole possession of fifth place on the WSU single-season three-point field goal list with 48. She ended the season two shy of fourth place.

- Wichita State dropped to 1-8 when shooting under 40 percent from the field. The Shockers shot 38.2 percent (26-68) against the Aces. WSU also fell to 4-11 when trailing at halftime and dropped to 2-3 in overtime games this season.
