OWomen's 1996 Season Review

The inaugural Missouri Valley Conference women's soccer season came to a close on Sunday, Nov. 10, as Evansville earned the league's first-ever women's soccer crown.

A superb final week of the season for Evansville, which included a win over No. 14 Minnesota and an MVC tournament title, was dampened as the Aces failed to earn one of the 32 spots in the NCAA Tournament field. Nevertheless, the first season of women's soccer was a successful one for the Valley.


Two first-year teams highlighted the 1996 season as Illinois State and Southwest Missouri State each started women's soccer programs for this season. The battle for first-year supremacy was a draw as the teams split two games, each winning 4-0.

Creighton was the only league team to survive its regular-season conference schedule unscathed, posting a 3-0 mark against league foes, while Eastern Illinois and Evansville each posted 16 wins, with the Panthers winning their first nine matches of the season.

Evansville's 16-4-1 record was highlighted by two wins against top-25 opponents, and the Aces ended the season ranked No. 24 in the nation by the National Soccer Coaches Association.

CU... Working Overtime

Creighton's 9-8-1 record this past season could have been noticeably better had the Lady Jays had success in overtime games. In 1996, Creighton posted an 0-3-1 mark in overtimes. The Lady Jays did, however, advance through the

MVC schedule unscathed, winning all three of their games against MVC members during the regular season this past year.

EIU... Century Toppers

Eastern Illinois' scoring tandem of Tracie Strother and Beth Aussin notched over 100 combined points this past season. Strother had 52 points to lead the league, while Aussin had 50 and ranked second in the MVC in scoring.

UE ... World Beaters

Evansville defeated two nationally ranked teams this past season, including Kentucky and Minnesota. Both of those teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament. As a whole, the league was 2-1 against teams ranked in the top 25.

ILS . . . Young and Old

Illinois State's top two scorers this past season included a senior and a freshman. Senior Michelle Prusko led the team with 14 points, while freshman Aimee Grahe had 13. Each player scored six goals during the year, which tied for ninth among the league statistical leaders.

SMS . . . Just Shy of .500

Southwest Missouri had a successful first season of women's soccer as the Lady Bears recorded an impressive 9-11 mark in the program's first year. The team had a streaky year, losing its first three before enjoying a six-game winning streak early in the season. SMS then had a six-game losing streak before righting itself at season's end with two wins in its last three contests.

VU . . . Take Me To Your Leader

Valparaiso GK Amy Cavanaugh suffered a torn ACL in the Crusaders' match against Dayton. Since her injury, the Crusaders compiled an 0-8 record and were outscored 47-0. Cavanaugh was named to the MVC all-freshman team and was an honorable mention all-conference selection.

EIU . . . Welcome to the Valley

Of the league's two affiliate members for women's soccer, Eastern Illinois had better success in its first year in the Missouri Valley. The Panthers won 16 games, doubling their season total of 1995 (8-11-1). In addition, Eastern Illinois had the best start of any MVC member, winning its first nine games before a 3-1 loss to Dayton on Oct. 4.

SMS . . . All or Nothing

Freshman goalie Beth Schneider of Southwest Missouri State picked up her eighth shutout of the year with a 4-0 win against Illinois State in the conference tournament. The Lady Bears, in fact, shut out their opponents in all but one of their wins. The lone non-shutout victory was a 9-1 spanking of Southwest Baptist.

UE . . . Regionally Speaking

During this past year, Evansville spent three weeks in the top 10 in the Great Lakes Region, which included the final two weeks of the season. The Aces reached their highest regional ranking (tie-3rd) and national ranking (24th) in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America final poll, which was released Nov. 11.
