Women's 1997 Season Review

In perhaps the most exciting MVC tournament soccer match, Evansville claimed a second-straight league title with a 2-2 'win' past Eastern Illinois in the title game. Officially a tie, the game was ultimately decided on penalty kicks, with the Purple Aces advancing, 5-4. After 90 minutes of regulation, EIU and UE then battled through four overtime periods, which included two sudden-death stanzas, before ultimately deciding the match on PKs. Evansville had regulation goals from Sandy Jakubczak and Shelean Roylance, while Eastern Illinois countered with second-half goals from Tracie Strother and Heather Ory.

As league champ, Evansville did not receive an automatic bid into this past year's NCAA tournament field. So for the second-straight year, the MVC did not have a representative in the postseason. Four of the league teams posted winning records, and three teams reached double-digit victories, including Evansville (14), Eastern Illinois (14) and Southwest Missouri State (12).

ILS...Offense Struggles

Illinois State could just not put the ball into the net in 1997. The Redbirds, just in their second season for women's soccer, were shut out 12 times and posted a 3-0 mark when scoring more than one goal. Despite the offensive woes, Illinois State battled to a third-place tie with Southwest Missouri State in the league standings with a 2-2-1 mark.

VU ... Crusaders Stop Skid

Valparaiso snapped its 13-game losing streak with a 2-2 tie against Toledo in the final week of the season, but the Crusaders still ended the season with a disappointing 1-19-1 mark. Beth Muskovich had a goal and an assist in the match against Toledo and finished the year with a team-best 10 points.

The Wait is Over


In 1997, the conference was in just its second year of sponsoring women's soccer, and therefore was not eligible for an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. However, that waiting period is two years, so the Valley is eligible for an automatic bid in 1998. Pending an NCAA tournament-field expansion decision, the league champ will play an NCAA play-in game at the Big West champ in 1998. If the 1998 bracket expands to 48 teams (the decision was to be made in August of 1998), the MVC would get an automatic NCAA berth.

CU... Bad Sandwich

Creighton started the season on a roll and ended the season with success, but the team struggled in the middle, resulting in a 9-7-2 overall mark and a surprising 1-4 league mark. The Lady Jays started the season with a 4-0-1 mark, which included an impressive tie at Colorado College, a team that later climbed into the national rankings. Creighton also won four of its last six outings, losing only to the league's top two units (*Eastern Illinois and Evansville*) in that stretch. It was a 1-5-1 mark during the middle of the season that hurt the Lady Jays in 1997.

ElU ... Streakin'

Eastern Illinois finished the 1997 season on a roll, losing only once in the team's final 11 games. The team started the season with an 0-3 record and ended the year with a 14-6-1 mark, meaning a 14-3-1 mark in the team's final 18 games. During that stretch, Eastern Illinois won six straight games, matching Evansville for the longest winning streak in the league last season. The Panthers own the league record for consecutive wins, having won nine straight to start the 1996 season.

IIE... Defense Wins

Evansville's defense was a key to its success in 1997. The Purple Aces only one goal during its five regular-season league games and allowed only 19 goals all year. Evansville's 0.85 team goals against average was the best in the league. The Purple Aces surrendered just five goals in their last nine outings, and all five of the teams' shutouts came during the final four weeks of the season. UE gave up a season high of just two goals, and that only happened in four games.

SMS... In the Lead

Southwest Missouri State's Jamie Hautzinger ended the season with a league-leading 33 points, which included a league-best 12 goals in 1997. It marked the second-straight year that Hautzinger had 30 or more points in a season, making her the only MVC player to accomplish that feat. Her 63 career points rank third on the all-time MVC scoring list.
