Women's 1998 Season Review

The 1998 season was highlighted by Evansville's appearance in the NCAA Tournament. It marked the first-ever NCAA bid by a Valley women's soccer team. The Purple Aces fell in the first round to nationally ranked Northwestern, 2-1 in overtime.

Evansville had earned the league's automatic berth into the NCAA tourney with a 2-1 overtime victory over Illinois State in the league tournament championship game. The Redbirds, meanwhile, had a phenomenal season, securing a tie for the regular-season championship with Evansville.

Redbirds, Purple Aces Share Top Spot

The Missouri Valley regular-season title came down to the final day as Illinois State hosted Evansville on Sunday, Oct. 25. The Redbirds put a stop to UE's 14-game winning streak against Valley foes with a 2-1 victory in Normal. The teams both ended the season with 5-1 marks and a share of the regular-season title.

UALR ... Team Awards


Junior Leslie Hawkins and freshman Kelli Johnson became the first soccer players in UALR history to receive post-season recognition as both were named second-team All-MVC. Hawkins broke the school record for career assists with one against Tennessee Tech in the season finale.

CU . . . Upward Mobility

Creighton has improved its record in each of the past three seasons, going from 7-11 in 1995, to 9-8-1 in 1996, 9-7-2 in 1997 and to 13-6 this past year.

EIU . . . A Perfect 10

With a 4-1 victory against Southwest Missouri State in the regular-season finale, Eastern Illinois improved to 10-6-1 on the season. It marks the third-straight year the Panthers have won at least 10 matches.

UE . . . Better Late, Than Never

After defeating Illinois State, 2-1, in the championship game of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament, Evansville has now won all three Valley tournaments. The Purple Aces needed a goal with only :12 remaining to send the match into overtime. Krista McKendree's game-tying goal at (89:48) was the latest goal that UE has ever scored in the six-year history of the program.

ISU . . . Born to Be Freed

Illinois State's Lindsay Freed set a school record for single-season points, and she also added her name to the Missouri Valley Conference record books. Freed had a hat trick in ISU's tournament semifinal win against Southwest Missouri State. She also tied league tournament records for goals in a tournament, points in a game and points in a tournament.

SMS . . . Bears Reach Semis, Again

For the second straight year, Southwest Missouri State reached the semifinals of the MVC Soccer Championship, and Eastern Illinois was involved in both of SMS's tourney trips. In 1997, Eastern Illinois

ousted the Lady Bears from the tournament and denied SMS a chance at a league title. Last year, Southwest Missouri upset EIU in the first round, earning the first-ever win for SMS against the Panthers, in five tries.

VU . . . Crusaders Show Improvement

Valparaiso claimed the No. 6 seed in the tournament for the third straight year, but the team has shown improvement under first-year head coach Stephan Anthony. The Crusaders notched three victories -- more than the past two years combined -- and scored a tie against Eastern Illinois in conference action.

CU . . . Dynamic Duo

For only the second time in ten years, the Creighton Bluejays had two players with 20 points or more in the same season. In fact, Jessica Powers (48) and Kristina Schoeck (25) are the most prolific single-season scoring tandem in CU history with 73 points.

EIU . . . Dynamic Duo, II

Seniors Beth Aussin (122 points) and Tracie Strother (110 points) finished their careers ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the Eastern Illinois record book for career points. Aussin's 44 assists rank her No. 1 in that category, while Strother's 43 goals rank her No. 1 in that statistic. Aussin is the league's all-time leading scorer with 99 points during Eastern Illinois' three years as a member of the conference.\
