

# Women's 2001 Season Review

As the winner of the 2001 IronKids Bread / MVC Soccer Championship, Evansville earned the Missouri Valley Conference's automatic berth to the 2001 NCAA Women's Soccer Championship.

It was the Purple Aces' third trip in four years to NCAA postseason.

In 2001, an expanded NCAA tournament included four teams at each of 16 first- and second-round sites. Evansville played No. 2 Santa Clara at Champaign, Ill., in the opening round. UE fell 3-0.

Evansville advanced after beating Southwest Missouri State at Sportport in Maryland Heights, Mo., 2-1, in the title game of the Conference tournament.

Illinois State, the league's regular-season champion, did not make the 64-team field. The Redbirds finished the 2001 campaign with a 13-5 record.

## Creighton...Purple Postseason

Creighton again fell to Evansville for the sixth-consecutive postseason as the teams met at SportPort in Maryland Heights, Mo., in the IronKids Bread/MVC Championship. The Purple Aces have ended the Bluejays' season six years in a row, outscoring Creighton 17-2 in five matches.

## Netminding...

Creighton goalkeeper Jaimie Thompson posted 12 wins last season for the Bluejays, the second-highest single-season total in school history. Her 1,728 minutes played last season was also the second-highest total, while her 86 saves rank fourth in a single-season.

## Birds and the Trees...

With Creighton's 2-0 win over Indiana State in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament play-in match, the Jays finished off a dominating two-game series against the Sycamores last year. In the two games, Creighton outscored Indiana State 8-1, while outshooting the Sycamores 63-5.

Creighton's defeat of Indiana State on Oct. 5 was its eighth home victory of the season, a number it had not reached since the Jays went a perfect 8-0 at home in 1994.

## Drury...Noteworthy

Jody Palazzolo was the second part of the Panthers' one-two punch. A member of last year's MVC All-Freshman team, Palazzolo recorded three goals and one assist in conference play in 2001.

## Under The Knife...

Meanwhile, Drury senior stand out Lotte Reijmers underwent successful knee surgery near the end of last season and began her rehab program. Lotte played in 10 games in 2001, but her absence was felt in the Panthers' final eight matches.

## Wright On...

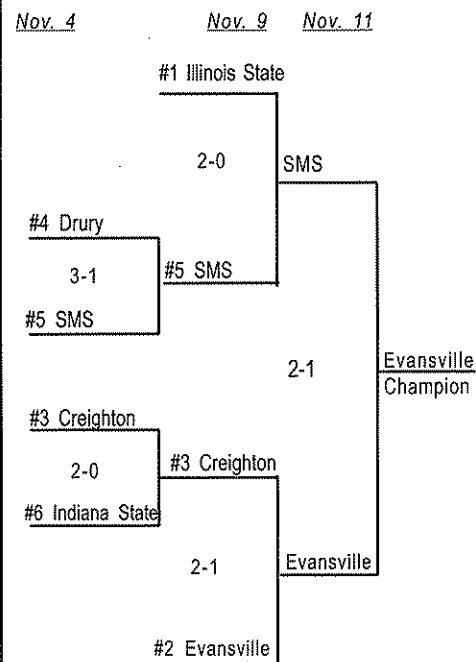
Drury's Carrie Wright was named to the NSCAA/adidas College Women's Scholar-Athlete Central Region Third Team. Wright, who was a First Team All-Missouri Valley selection in 2001, has a 3.87 grade point average while pursuing a major in mathematics. The Missouri Valley Conference had two players recognized by the NSCAA and adidas. Besides Wright, Sara Hovland

of Creighton was recognized. Hovland has a 3.45 grade point average and is a philosophy/3-D Art major.

## Evansville...Tourney Bound Again

Evansville improved to 12-1-1 all-time in MVC Tournament matches. The Purple Aces won the league's first four tournaments, from 1996 through 1999, before finishing second to SMS in 2000.
